



We are located 16 kilometers from Leticia, the capital of the Colombian Amazon, in an area of 240 hectares of Amazon jungle, where we have developed a responsible tourism program and a way of life based on agro-ecological principles and practices, the use of renewable energies, appropriate technologies for the care of water such as composting toilets, the restoration of ecosystems which have been interfered with and the protection of a natural reserve area that covers 98% of the plot.


The nature reserve is a social enterprise linked to Hábitat Sur Foundation. Part of the income generated by the Responsible Tourism Program is reinvested in the Foundation's cultural, environmental education and community development initiatives.t



Who we are

Hábitat Sur is an initiative of people who are deeply connected with the Amazon and its people from the heart.

We firmly believe in the enormous social, cultural and ecological capital of this region. To preserve it, we have created cultural and environmental spaces in which we promote the exchange of traditional, academic and empirical knowledge about the Amazon and promote more sustainable practices for life in the jungle.





Our spaces

The reserve has three cabins that have been built using local bio-construction techniques mixed with modern architecture, respecting the region's traditions and highlighting the knowledge of indigenous peoples of the Amazon in the management and construction of their own built environments.


Toucan's Nest & Canopeé Suite

How about waking up 12 meters high in the middle of the Amazon jungle?

This nest, with two rooms and a terrace is perfect for watching birds, squirrels and monkeys.

Tapir Cabin

Enjoy the unforgettable experience of witnessing the beautiful lake view from the balcony and enjoying the sounds of nature around you.

Capacity: Up to four (4) people. There is a double bed on the upper floor and a single bed and a hammock on the ground floor. Services: Solar powered energy, dry toilet and outdoor shower.












Geodesic Dome

The geometry of this dome inspires harmony and balance, ideal for a deep rest in nature.

Capacity: Up to 5 people. One double bed and up to three singles.

Services: Separate sanitary unit with two dry toilets and two showers. Solar powered energy. Outdoor kiosk with hammock.




















What does our plan include?



- Sanitary unit with 6 bathrooms, 6 showers and a laundry area.

All excursions outside our nature reserve include:


- Local transportation (land and/or river)

Visit to traditional malocas (an ancestral longhouse used by the natives of the Amazon)


Visit Uitoto, Bora or Macuna families who still maintain their traditional way of life in the maloca. Visitors will be able to share daily activities with the family members, learn about the rituals of mambe, ambil and rapé, among other aspects of their culture and cosmogony. cosmogonie.



Yahuarcaca Lakes Excursion

The Yahuarcaca Lakes constitute the most important lake system in Leticia. Around 14 indigenous communities live on its riverbank, mainly Ticuna. In winter, river dolphins come to its deep waters to have their young and hundreds of birds of different species nest in its surroundings.

Javari River Excursion


The Javarí River marks the border between Brazil and Peru. Communities such as the Morubo, Matiz and Matsé live along its riverbank. In summer, the white beaches that form on the riverbank are ideal for turtles to lay their eggs and for alligators to sunbathe. Pink and gray dolphins, anacondas, boas, piranhas, hundreds of birds and other animals are frequently sighted on excursions to these places of wild beauty. Hikers will be able to fish, trek in the jungle and paddle in canoes.



Visit to Puerto Nariño


The first sustainable municipality in Colombia offers its visitors the chance to walk quietly through its pedestrian-only streets, learn about the Ticuna, Cocama and Yagua cultures that share this territory and visit the Lakes of Tarapoto, recently named a RAMSAR site.

Visitors can participate in cultural activities at Hábitat Sur's Ngüe Chica Cultural Center.



Tacana Jungle Expedition


Hikers will take a jungle trek along the banks of the Tacana River, where they will learn to set camp in the jungle, fish and enjoy the sighting of fauna and flora.



Calderón River Trek

After an 8-hour trek through the jungle, the hikers will arrive at the Calderón River, where they will stay in hammocks or beds in a traditional Amazonian house.


Activities in-place include fishing, learning about medicinal plants and enjoying the sighting of fauna and flora.



Visit to River Turtles Conservation Community Project

Enjoy a day supporting a Cocama indigenous organization that protects Amazon River Turtles. Visitors will take part on cultural activities around the relevance of turtles for the communities and their role in local ecosystems, they will participate on reforestation efforts aimed at providing food for the turtles and will be able to accompany local expert guides on their nest-watching rounds and -depending on the time of the year- they could watch baby turtles hatch.
